When Gerry Met Jim . . . and the Swim Got Started



It was 2008, and for several years, Gerry Oakes had been the cornerstone of long-distance swims in Nassau County that raised funds for cancer research as well as for groups like Fighting Chance that provided cancer patients with psycho-social counseling during their cancer journeys.

Now Gerry aspired to raise even more funds by establishing a long-distance swim as a major summer event for the Hamptons. Just at that time, as fate would have it, Gerry met up with Jim Arnold, a civic-minded East End resident who was a leader of the East Hampton Volunteer Ocean Rescue group.



When they first met, Gerry and Jim compared notes about all of the 20-mile swims around the world that they had completed and those that were on their "bucket lists." These two guys really love to swim! Better yet, they love organizing community swims for good causes.

Before long, the Hamptons Swim Against Cancer was born and it has been going strong from 2009 through this summer's 2014 event . . . 6 years in a row!

Meet the Swim Organizers & East End Charity Beneficiary



Since 1987, Swim Across America has been dedicated to raising money for cancer care support, and cancer research through swimming-related events. There are over 20 SAA chapters across the United States. East Hampton Volunteer Ocean Rescue is comprised of volunteer lifeguards who respond to 911 dispatched emergencies year round in East Hampton.

EHVOR members also coordinate community swim events (and provide safety and supervision for them) including the Hamptons Swim Against Cancer





Since 2002, Fighting Chance, through its staff of healthcare professionals, has provided free-of-charge counseling to thousands of newly-diagnosed cancer patients on the East End of Long Island. By providing these patients with a skilled navigator during their cancer journey, the patient stands a better chance – a real fighting chance – of beating the disease.
